SDRCC Announces New Roster of Arbitrators and Mediators and Amendments to its Procedural Rules

Montréal (Québec) - The Sport Dispute Resolution Centre of Canada (SDRCC) has amended the Canadian Sport Dispute Resolution Code (Code) and has appointed a new roster of arbitrators and mediators; both changes are effective as of February 1, 2011.

The SDRCC undertook an internal review of the Code which was intended mostly to clarify the interpretation of some of its procedures, including new provisions for dealing with parties under the age of majority, precisions on the availability of the resolution facilitation process, and amended provisions concerning the format and confidentiality of proceedings. Some other changes have been made to ensure that the Code remained compliant with the anti-doping rules after the CCES amended the Canadian Anti-Doping Program. Following a call for applications published in 2010, the SDRCC has selected highly qualified arbitrators and mediators to constitute its new roster.
