SDRCC Announces New Annotated Version of the Canadian Sport Dispute Resolution Code

Montréal (Québec) - The Sport Dispute Resolution Centre of Canada (SDRCC) is pleased to announce the electronic publication of a new annotated version of the Canadian Sport Dispute Resolution Code.

The annotations in this publication link the procedural rules, under which SDRCC proceedings are conducted, with key references to relevant arbitral awards rendered by SDRCC arbitrators. Intended first and foremost to serve as a resource tool for arbitrators and mediators in conducting SDRCC proceedings, the Annotated Code is expected to also greatly benefit legal representatives as well as unrepresented parties in preparing for their cases.

The SDRCC wishes to express its heartfelt thanks to a dedicated group of students from the Osgoode Hall Law School Public Interest Requirement (OPIR) program, as well as to the SDRCC Board members and roster arbitrators, for their invaluable collaboration in the development of the Annotated Code over the past several months.
