He represented Field Hockey Canada from 2003 - 2009 competing in the 2006 Commonwealth Games, 2007 Pan-American Games (gold medalist) and the 2008 Olympic Games. Outside of the national program, Anthony was a varsity athlete at UBC and played overseas winning the Championnat de France and the Australian University Games.

Anthony has been an active member of the sport community having volunteered with UBC's Thunderbird Athlete Council, "I'm Going to UBC" program, and on the board of directors of BC Athlete Voice. Over the past 15 years he has been a passionate coach with club, university and provincial high performance programs. He was awarded the Thunderbird Athlete Council Leadership Award by his peers and was selected to represent Canada at the International Olympic Academy.

Anthony has recently completed his Juris Doctor at the University of Victoria Faculty of Law and will begin his career at Fasken Martineau DuMoulin LLP in the summer of 2015. He also holds an undergraduate degree from the University of British Columbia where he graduated head of the Human Kinetics Exercise Science Program and won the Bobby Gaul Memorial Trophy as UBC's outstanding male graduating athlete. Before entering law school, Anthony was accepted into medical school and was a finalist for the Rhodes Scholarship.

Retired from competitive sport, Anthony is thrilled to have the time to once again enjoy sport recreationally. He looks forward to applying his multi-faceted experience in sport to the benefit of the SDRCC.
