He has many thousands of hours in the arbitrator and mediator roles and has served on the roster, either as an arbitrator or mediator or has performed arbitrations or mediations at the request of the Nova Scotia Department of Labour and Environment, the Nova Scotia Department of Justice for Compensation for Survivors of Institutional Abuse, Canadian Transportation Agency, Centre for Sport & Law, Sport Dispute Resolution Centre of Canada (SDRCC), Farm Debt Mediation Service (Agriculture & Agri-Food Canada), Public Works & Government Services Canada, Portfolio Management Association of Canada and the Registrar of Condominiums. He serves as Chair of the Sable Offshore Energy Project Commercial Fisheries Gear & Vessel Damage Compensation Board.
