1. Approval Date

Thus, this policy sets in place a culture of education and awareness towards understanding *Maltreatment* and *Discrimination*, committed to advancing a respectful sporting environment for all *Participants*. This policy outlines established practices which support the education, prevention, and awareness of *Maltreatment* and *Discrimination*.

- **2.1.1** Have learned about *Maltreatment* and *Discrimination*;

3. Authority and Scope

- **3.2** Under the *UCCMS*, *Minor Participants* are defined as individuals who are under the age of 19 years old. It is at all times the responsibility of the adult *Participant* to know the age of a *Minor*.

4. Interpretation

5. Mandatory Safe Sport Education and/or Training

6. Accommodations for Education and/or Training

6.1 Persons with Disabilities

- **6.1.1** Any mandatory safe sport *Education* and/or *Training* must be accessible to all *Participants*, including those with temporary or permanent disabilities.
- **6.1.2** In the event that an *Education* and/or *Training* is deemed inaccessible, *Participants* should contact the provider of the *Education* and/or *Training*.

6.2 Exemptions

7. Tracking and Monitoring
